30 baby bunnies to die today!

Due to lack of experienced bottle feeders, volunteers, BWF is unable to take this batch of baby bunnies this time. This is the first time we had to say "no" – so if no one picks them up, they will be killed today. This is the only batch since June 15, 2008 that is NOT going to be picked up by Bunny World at this time. Also, we got 10 NEW babies this weekend, so we are already having a hard time dealing with the current load. If you cannot help, please cross post, if you can please contact me first, and then give a call to Tanya at (323) 224-2350 or Wendell Bowers at (323) 224-2350 if you can save them. We cannot help with supplies (although Wendell promised KMR! So, that's 90% of it...you need colostrum pills, heating pads, acidophilus, alfalfa hay and pellets) but I will be happy to send info on how to take care of baby bunnies and guide you all the way, and help with adopting them once they get to that point...you can also download info from our website under the Bunny Care and contact me with any questions that you might have. The babies have been impounded on Saturday by LAPD, which means that they have not been fed milk since then. They need to be picked up urgently. If you or anyone reliable can do this, please let me know so that I can clear your name with the shelter and confirm your affiliation with Bunny World.

Babies need you...BWF has saved 600 babies to date in less than 2 years. We are not stopping, we just can't take this particular load because it will jeopardize the current 60 buns in house.

If we had 14 RELIABLE people who can bottle feed and COMMIT to be here ONCE A WEEK FOR 4 – 6 HRS min EITHER AM OR PM FOR THE NEXT TWO MONTHS, THEN I WOULD SAY YES...we have ONLY 3 SO FAR, SO 11 shifts MORE to go. The longer we wait the less of a chance that they will make it. As you can see they are 10 days old and it's a matter of hours... You can also do this from home. That's preferable....Just imagine if all of you (130 PEOPLE) took one OR ONE FORTH OF a baby (30 OF THEM), they would make it... All you have to do is feed it AM and PM and watch for diarrhea or pneumonia...and follow the protocol we designed for each. It would take us here 12 hrs, but it would take YOU less than an hour a day...We will help find them homes, but you will have to be flexible..We have found 400 homes in a year and a half, so 30 won't be a problem if they make it and if you are willing to work with BWF.
